International world-class poker tournaments find home at The Star Gold Coast

The Star Gold Coast continues to build its reputation for drawing mega events to south east Queensland by confirming the arrival of two coveted international poker tournaments early next year.

Teaming up with World Poker Tour (WPT) for a second time, and Poker Central for the first time, The Star Gold Coast will have some of the world's leading players competing for multi-million dollar prize pools across 11 days starting on the Australia Day weekend.

The 'Australian Poker Open' will run for eight days from Saturday 25 January, while 'Super High Roller Bowl Australia' – with buy-ins of \$250,000 – will be contested over three days from Sunday 2 February.

The Super High Roller Bowl Australia will see poker professionals playing for a purse of around \$5 million, making it one of the richest three-day tournaments in the world.

The Star Gold Coast COO Jessica Mellor said both tournaments, held previously in destinations including China and the United Kingdom, were coming to Australia for the first time.

They follow the success of the first WPT Festival on the Gold Coast last month, staged in The Star Gold Coast's new state-of-the-art poker space.

"Now that we have signed with WPT and Poker Central, we couldn't be more excited about some of the world's top poker players coming to our property for a thrilling 11 days of high-stakes poker next year," Ms Mellor said.

"WPT and Poker Central were looking to extend their international footprint, and for us it created the perfect opportunity to show why The Star Gold Coast is the true home of poker in Australia.

"It's also a further example of how we're promoting the Gold Coast to the world and driving more tourism to the region. We're committed to the Gold Coast, we're committed to tourism, and bringing such high-profile events to the Gold Coast ensures we're assisting this city to showcase its ability to compete with international markets.

"Earlier this year, we were officially recognised as one of the world's best integrated resorts. Introducing these tournaments to Australia for the first time only strengthens that reputation for staging global events and attracting the biggest names in entertainment, business, and sport."

"Creating the Australian Poker Open and Super High Roller Bowl Australia represents a key milestone for Poker Central and an important moment for our business as we further our international reach," said Sampson Simmons, President of Poker Central.

“As we bring our premier high roller event brands to new players and new destinations around the globe, such as The Star Gold Coast, our PokerGO streaming subscribers continue reaping the rewards of captivating poker content featuring the world’s best players.”

Both events will stream exclusively on PokerGO, Poker Central’s OTT streaming service.

The Australian Poker Open will have a total of seven different events over eight days, with buy-ins ranging from \$10K-\$100K in varying poker formats, including No Limit Hold’em, Pot Limit Omaha, and Short Deck. The player who earns the most High Roller of the Year points during the series will be named the Australian Poker Open Champion and will receive the first-ever Australian Poker Open trophy.

Super High Roller Bowl Australia is a three-day event with a buy-in of \$250,000 and includes a single re-entry option. In addition to the multimillion-dollar first place prize, the event’s winner will receive the custom-designed Super High Roller Bowl Australia championship ring. As is customary across other Poker Central high roller events, the first on-time entry in all events will be rake-free.
