"Through our ongoing partnership, we hope to continue raising awareness about the need to protect our natural surroundings and the unique wildlife that call this beautiful part of the world home."

The Currumbin Wildlife Hospital is one of the world's busiest wildlife hospitals and admits over 12,000 patients each year – a service provided free of charge to the community through the work of the Currumbin Wildlife Hospital Foundation, which The Star Gold Coast has proudly supported since 2015.

Currumbin Wildlife Hospital Foundation Director, Whitney Luzzo-Kelly, welcomed The Star Gold Coast's support as they entered one of their busiest seasons.
